

USING WHAT YOU HAVE ACCESSIBILITY FEATURES

FOR iOS SYSTEMS (Ipad and Iphone)

FEATURE	DESCRIPTION	ACTIVATE BY	HOW TO USE
Accessibility Shortcut	With Accessibility Shortcut, you can quickly turn on or off specific accessibility features by triple-clicking the side button or triple-clicking the home button.	Set up Accessibility Shortcut: Go to Settings, Accessibility, Accessibility Shortcut, then select the features you use the most that you would like to have connected to the shortcut.	Triple-click the side button or home button.
Dark Mode	Turn on Dark Mode for a better viewing experience in low-light environments.	Go to settings, tap display and brightness, select dark to turn on dark mode. You can also set to automatic which will turn on dark mode automatically at sunset.	Once you activate this feature it will stay on until you turn it off.
Adjust text size and/or turn on bold text	If you have vision challenges, you can customize the display settings to make the screen easier to see.	Go to Settings, Accessibility, Display, & Text Size to adjust the size of the text (slide the font size slider) or to make the text show in boldface characters.	Once you activate this feature it will stay on until you turn it off.
Increase Contrast	This setting improves the contrast and legibility by altering color and text styling.	Go to Settings, Accessibility, Display, & increase contrast. Toggle the button to turn on this feature.	Once you activate this feature it will stay on until you turn it off.
Speak Screen	Have iOS speak the entire screen.	Go to Settings, Accessibility, Spoken Content. Toggle Speak Screen.	To use, swipe down from top of screen using 2 fingers to hear the page content.
Voices	Choose a voice and dialect	Go to Settings, Accessibility, Spoken Content, voices, choose the language and then choose the voice you prefer.	Once you activate this feature it will stay on until you change it.
Assistive Touch - Home button	Assistive Touch puts a small circular button anywhere on your screen at all times. Press it to access different functions, like turning on voice controls, checking notifications or returning to the home screen.	Go to Settings, Accessibility, and Touch. Toggle on the Assistive Touch button. Select Customize top level menu. Use the +/- to make the number of icons you prefer. Start with 1. Touch the button and choose what you would like it to control. In this case choose home.	Your button will appear on the screen for use and will stay on the screen until you turn off Assistive Touch.
